PLACE - Patient Led Assessment of the Care Environment

ESCV delivering Healthwatch in East Sussex, is recruiting Patient Assessors to undertake the annual Patient Led Assessments of the Care Environment (PLACE). The assessments will apply to hospitals, hospices and day treatment centres providing NHS funded care and the programme commences 3rd March 2014 and ends 30th May 2014.

Want to be a patient assessor?

The assessments give patients and the public a voice that can be heard in any discussion about local standards of care, in the drive to give people more influence over the way their local health and care services are run.

Assessment teams are a collaboration between staff and patient assessors, therefore patients must make up at least 50 per cent of the assessment team. Anyone who uses the service can be a patient assessor, including current patients, their family and visitors, carers, patient advocates or patient council members. The only restriction is that current staff are not able to assess the hospital they work at as a patient assessor.

NHS Trolley Wait Times

Authorised Representatives have just completed a series of visits at the Conquest Hospital Accident & Emergency Department in Hastings, looking at NHS Trolley waiting times.

This included talking to patients, carers, family members as well as staff and ambulance crews to gain some insight on the impact this national issue has on local people.

The report will be ready towards the end of February and we will notify you when the document is ready to view.

In addition to this, Healthwatch East Sussex will also be writing up another report based on all of the work we have carried out on the Pathway to Urgent Care.

Herstmonceux Information Centre Drop-In

You can go along to the Village Information Centre in Herstmonceux to pick up information about Healthwatch East Sussex, every Wednesday afternoon 2.30pm-4.30pm. You can also feedback your experiences of using health and care services, and how living in the rural parts of the county affects your access to these services. This is the first Healthwatch East Sussex pilot for the information and signposting service and we are absolutely delighted Herstmonceux Village Centre has been so enthusiastic about offering a drop in service. We hope local people will find the service useful.

Chris has kindly offered to be a "Healthwatch Champion" and will be demonstrating how individuals and Centres like Herstmonceux can get involved and help spread the word. We really hope this pilot is a success and that it will encourage others to get involved.

The "Bedroom tax" Universal Credit, Benefit Caps, PIP, ESA, DESSS – are you confused?
